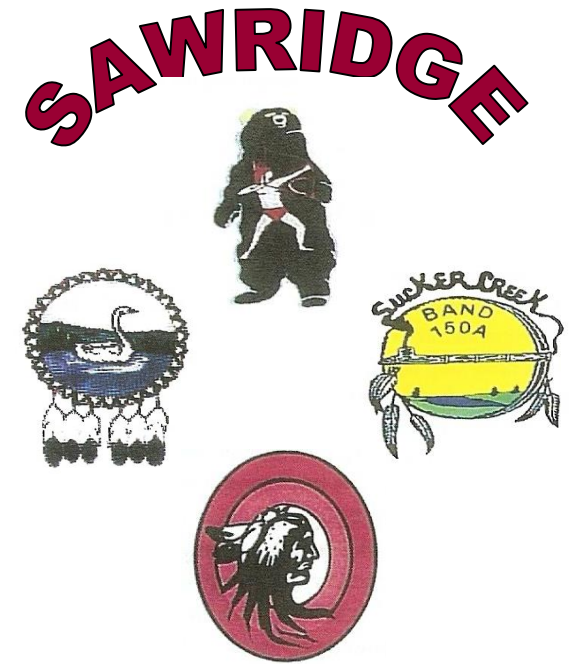

- Five scholarships of \$3000 per year for a renewable term of three consecutive scholastic years are available.

- The award must be applied to furthering the recipient's education at the post secondary level within 12 months of receipt.
- Scholarships will be awarded to students in one payment based on the student's successful completion of the course.
- Scholarship will be awarded on the basis of academic achievement in Grade 12 or equivalency. Applicants will be ranked for scholarship eligibility based on academic performance.
- Successful applicants will be Grade 12 graduates, Grade 12 Equivalency Graduates or, Adults within recognized continuing education programs.
